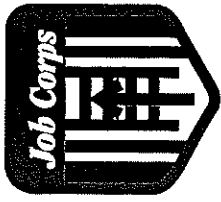

## What is Job Corps?

Job Corps is a no-cost education program administered by the U.S. Department of Labor that helps young people improve the quality of their lives through vocational and academic programs.

Job Corps' mission is to teach them the skills they need to become employable, independent, and place them in meaningful jobs or further education.

## Steps to Apply

1. Apply to your desired affiliated college
2. Complete FAFSA to see if you are Pell Grant Eligible (FAFSA.gov)
3. Take College Placement test at affiliated college
4. Contact Job Corp representative to schedule an application session
5. Collect required documents for application
6. Complete application
7. Collect any other required documents and deliver them to your Admissions Counselor
8. Receive pre-arrival call and attend scheduled orientation

## General Program Eligibility Requirements

Students must meet all requirements to be eligible for the Pittsburgh Job Corps College Program.

- Age: 17 to 24 years old
- High School Diploma or GED
- Verification of Income

- Eligible for Federal PELL Grant (FAFSA.gov)
- College Placement Test Scores
- Full Time College Students (12 credits Fall & Spring, 6 credits Summer)
- Stay Above 2.0 GPA

- Pass Drug Test and Background Check
- Orientation at Pittsburgh Job Corps Center One Week: Mon-Fri (8:15AM to 3:00PM)
- High School to College Transition Course at CCAC (30 HOURS Daytime/One Week)

## Required Documents

The following is a list of documents your admissions counselor will require to complete your application. Gather as many of these as you can before your interview and application session

- Legal Identification (Drivers License/State ID, Passport, Green Card, etc.)
- Birth Certificate
- Social Security Card
- High School Diploma and/or Transcripts
- Proof of Income (W-2 Form, Employment Verification, Pay Stubs, Proof of Public Assistance [ex. SNAP, Food Stamps], Statement of Support etc.)

- Pell Grant Award Letter (FAFSA)
- College Placement Test Scores
- College Transcripts (If currently enrolled)

- Medical Insurance Card
- Immunization Records
- IEP/Psychological Evaluation
